We hope you enjoy this update and as always if you have any questions about the content of this newsletter or about your participation in AccessILD please don't hesitate to get in touch.





To be able to develop better treatments and hopefully cures for these diseases, we need the data and insights that only you as patients can provide.



Palliative telecare team improves quality of life in COPD, ILD

A recent study has found that patients who received telecare from a nurse and social worker reported better quality of life vs. usual care, and disease-specific health status, depression and anxiety also improved with this intervention.

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
